### A Note from Nancy - August 2018

The 79th General Convention of the Episcopal Church was held in Austin, Texas in early July and I was there! It was an experience that I will not soon forget. Many, many details of church life were discussed, dissected, put back together and voted upon and always in the spirit of love and awareness for the interests of all parties. There was humor and good will. (If you have a Twitter account, please see #79CGpigeon.)

The opportunities for public witness to the Gospel were many. The #metoo movement was recognized by a very moving liturgy during which letters from both women and men who have been sexually abused and/or harassed by those with authority over them were read aloud. My prayer is that this will be the beginning of the process to change the culture of the Episcopal Church to truly live into our Baptismal Covenant "to respect the dignity of every human being" (BCP p. 305)

There was a public demonstration by our bishops denouncing gun violence and over 1000 people traveled by bus to Hutto Detention Center to protest the separation of children from their caregivers at the borders of our country. The mothers inside the center were very moved by the fact that so many people came out in their support.

We had the opportunity to worship with each other every day. Over 1000 Episcopalians saying the responses together is incredible. Most services were a mixture of English and Spanish with translations in our bulletins. The bulletins themselves were in our "virtual binders" on I-pads loaned to all the participants for the duration of the convention. (www.generalconvention.org) Lots of new experiences happened every day.

Many resolutions were voted on. A few highlights:

 Liturgical Revision – the 1979 BCP will be in use while changes to include more gender-neutral language, rites for same-sex marriage, and other necessary modifications are worked out. There is no definite time period for all of this to happen. A Task Force will be established to oversee revisions in concert with the Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music (SCLM)

- The same-sex marriage rites currently in trial use will continue to be used until more permanent rites are approved for use. One point of contention here is changing the definition of marriage in our catechism which will require more prayer and discernment.
- The Episcopal Church in Cuba, which has been missing from our church since 1966 has been reinstated. (There was much joy and rejoicing.)
- Individuals and churches were encouraged to invest with gun manufacturers in such a way that ethical decisions are made to minimize lethal and criminal uses of their products.
- <u>Lesser Feasts and Fasts 2018</u> was approved with additions of multicultural liturgies for use in our churches.
- All Episcopalians are encouraged to build a Beloved Community made up of healers, reconcilers and justice makers to respond to racial injustice in the church and in the world.

There were many, many more topics discussed. The deputation from the Diocese of Pittsburgh met every evening to discuss topics that would be coming up the next day. It was a group that took its work seriously but with humor and collegiality.
