Sermon:

Alleluia! Christ is risen. *The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!*

I have to admit that the reading from I Peter spoke to me in a lot of ways this week. The writer talks about a "fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you." Yes, we have an ordeal taking place among us right now but I do not believe it is a test. It is a situation that can be explained by science that is harmful to humanity and it is happening to humans all around the world. To my way of thinking, because I am a scientist as well as a priest, it is part of the way creation works. However, that is not the point of this sermon. The point is that we are all going through something that requires us to rely on God to see us through.

The writer says, "cast all your anxiety on God, because God cares for you. Discipline yourselves, keep alert." Keep your faith in Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit as well. Using God in all three persons of the Trinity will guide us through this and we will be stronger on the other side. The writer says: God will "restore, support, strengthen and establish you."

Let us be mindful of this as we move into a different phase of life that relaxes some of the guidelines, let us not abandon what we've learned from "sheltering in grace". Let us continue to wash our hands for at least 20 seconds, wear masks in public and remain at least 6 feet away from other people. No matter how much we long for human touch, let us refrain from handshakes, hugs and high fives. These precautions are not only to protect ourselves but also to protect our neighbors.

And let us continue to be mindful of our neighbors. Let us continue to order take out from local restaurants and provide a decent tip to the workers there. Let us continue to thank those who put themselves in harm's way so that we can buy food, receive our mail, newspapers and packages. Let us continue to check on friends, family members, actual neighbors and those that are vulnerable to the virus and help them receive what they need. Let us pray for those who do not understand the risks to themselves and others if they do not follow the guidelines for whatever reason. Let us be a voice of reason if we find ourselves in a confrontational situation.

Have faith that we will one day be able to worship together again in community. Have patience that we can wait until it is safe for everyone. Have understanding that life will never be as it was but will be even better. Trust that God is present in this ordeal and knows what we need. God will provide, Christ will answer our prayers and the Holy Spirit will guide us in truth.
