Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Jesus said to the twelve disciples, "A disciple is not above the teacher, nor a slave above the master; it is enough for the disciple to be like the teacher, and the slave like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household!

"So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.

"Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven.

For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and one's foes will be members of one's own household.

Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."

Sermon:

Jesus said "whoever loves 'anyone' more than me is not worthy of me and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me." During this turbulent time in our lives, we are being called to take up our cross and follow Jesus. Do we have to follow Jesus all the way to death as he did? Not necessarily. Are we called to do everything Jesus did? Not necessarily. We are called to do what we can in this day and age to make a positive difference in people's lives. What does that mean? In our Baptismal Covenant we promise, "with God's help" to "strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human being."

My thoughts are to find ways to start a relationship with someone who is different from me and you. Talk to someone whose skin color is different from yours. Ask them to describe their lives to you and really listen to what they are saying. That's how things started with our transgender friends. I stopped to have a conversation with Catty-Anne not long after I moved here. It was several years of

bumping into each other and continuing that conversation that led to her and the others coming to church and being welcomed here. We are now family and I am anxious to get to the time we can be together in church once again.

Where does your mind go when you hear the chant of "Black lives matter"? When I first heard it a few years ago I thought to myself: yes, black lives do matter but actually all lives matter. After all, I am a priest and a nurse. Every life is important and must be honored and respected. However, I now understand that right now, this minute, it really is – "Black lives matter". That is because black men and women are being killed by police and those who hate because of race right now and have been for years. Now is the time to end that. When we rally to save endangered species, we name the polar bear, or seal, or bald eagle, not all animals. When we rally to save human lives, we must also name who needs to be saved. Now, it is black lives matter and brown lives matter. Racism must be vanquished.

I grew up in Sewickley, PA. just west of Pittsburgh. I went to school with black kids, played with black kids, was taught to play the piano by a wonderful black woman who lived on the other corner of the block we lived on. Sure, I saw the color of their skin but it didn't matter to me. We were friends. When I think back I do remember that the black families lived in their own section of town which was half a block from my street. Even though we played together, we did not visit each other's homes. There was still a *de facto* segregation. But I was not aware of it at that age.

Then, my family moved to Louisiana in 1963, when I was 13. That's when I learned the hard lessons of Jim Crow and segregation. I was there for the forced integration of schools. I saw hate on a white boy's face when looking at and confronting a black classmate because of a perceived slight in the cafeteria line. It was awful and because of it, I continue to abhor racism to this day. It is wrong no matter where it raises it's ugly head. I have observed racism here in Johnstown too. That look on a racist's face when they just see someone whose skin is black is ugly and uncalled for. We need to change that look. We need to stop racism now.

One of my favorite songs from the musical South Pacific is called "You've got to be carefully taught".

You've got to be taught to hate and fear You've got to be taught from year to year It's got to be drummed in your dear little ear You've got to be carefully taught

You've got to be taught to be afraid Of people whose eyes are oddly made And people whose skin is a diff'rent shade You've got to be carefully taught

You've got to be taught before it's too late Before you are six or seven or eight To hate all the people your relatives hate You've got to be carefully taught

Yes, people have to be taught to hate. Let us work to stop those lessons. Let us work to help people unlearn those lessons. Let us work to eliminate racism in our lifetime or, at least, make a start. With God's help. Amen.
