Romans 8:1-11

There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law-- indeed it cannot, and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

Matthew 13:1-9,18-23

Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!"

"Hear then the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

Sermon

Earlier this week someone from Southmont on the Neighborhood Digest sent out an alarm to warn everyone that someone was stealing roses from people's yards. Several of her rose blooms had been clipped off and taken away. In a matter of minutes many others in the neighborhood around her suggested that instead of people stealing her roses it was deer that had eaten them. Knowing that deer are present in the area, I find this a very plausible explanation. I just wasn't aware that deer eat roses. Deer have eaten several different flowers in my yard and they love tomato plants. This year, I have a plastic fence around the tomatoes which are in pots as well as a potted citronella plant right in front of the fence. The deer don't like the smell of the citronella. So far, none of the tomatoes plants have been eaten. My neighbor next door has been spraying a deer repellent around his tomato plants and so far none of them have been eaten. We shall see who wins this battle this year.

But what does that have to do with our Gospel reading today? What does that have to do with "the parable of the sower"? In Jesus' explanation of the parable, he likens the seed that the sower sows to the "word of the kingdom" or the word of God. Then he talks about how that word is received and whether it will eventually bear good fruit. With all that is going on in the world today, my thoughts have been going repeatedly to Jesus' teaching: Love God and love your neighbor as I have loved you. These two commandments are the basis for all that Jesus did and all that Jesus said. These two commandments are the basis for all the we do and say as well since we are Jesus to everyone we meet.

Those two commandments are the word of the kingdom that we sow into the world every day. The truth is that we can't just say the words we have to live them as well. We have to be examples of the people that hear the word, nurture the word and share the word to the world. That is not an easy thing to do and not all of God's people are willing to listen and change just because we say so.

A great example of this right now is how many people are wearing masks and social distancing when they are in public. It has been scientifically proven that wearing masks and social distancing reduce the spread of the Covid-19 virus. Many of us understand this finding and are doing our part. Others, however, discount the scientific findings and refuse to comply. Others are more concerned with their freedoms to do what they please regardless of the consequences to themselves or anyone else. Others are listening to naysayers who do not believe that there even is a virus causing many deaths around the world. We have been given the gift of making our own choices but it is so frustrating to us Jesus people when the choices of some effect what happens to their neighbors even to the point of sickness and death.

The same is true about our desire to end racism. We can preach all we want that hatred and discrimination have no place in this world. We can teach and show by example that our community can be a nurturing environment for everyone but there will be people who continue to believe otherwise. There will be people who have no desire to change their ways of thinking. There will be people who continue to follow and believe those that are ignorant and work to keep bigotry and inequality present in our lives. There will be people who will fight those who want to bring about righteous change.

We are Jesus people. We, the people of St. Mark's are the church. We, the people of St. Mark's, must do our part to change the world. We, the people of St. Mark's must take the word of God and sow it out into the world like the sower in the parable. The sower didn't worry about what soil the seed would land on. The sower just sowed everywhere. We must do the same. We must sow the word of the kingdom everywhere and then follow through with preaching the word so that people understand it and preaching the word by doing what is right so that people see and comprehend what it takes to make a difference in our corner of the world. Meet and get to know people who are different from us. Learn how we are different but also learn how much we are the same. Let us do all we can to be sure that the word of the kingdom falls on good soil so that it is heard and understood. Then the people of Johnstown will "bear fruit and yield, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."
