Sermon

It can be confusing to read the letters written by St. Paul. Part of the problem lies in the fact that some of the letters were actually written by Paul and some were not but attributed to him for one reason or another. The letter to the Romans is one that scholars believe was actually written by Paul to try to send a message to the church in Rome that was having some difficulties among its members. In particular, he was making the observation that there is no difference between the Jewish Christians and the gentile Christians. Everyone was a member of the same body of Christ regardless of what they may have believed before coming to Jesus.

I said earlier this month that one of my favorite passages in scripture comes from Romans 8: "nothing can separate us from the love of God through Jesus Christ, our Lord." Our reading for today from the same letter says "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." I like this too, especially as we navigate the world we are living in now.

What is the will of God? How do we discern that? We need to be asking ourselves every minute as we speak, do, and live every day. We are making decisions that will impact ourselves, our families and our neighbors more than ever. When do I wear a mask? When do I wash my hands or use hand sanitizer? Oops, I have to remember not to touch my face. When I see someone being bullied, how do I safely step in and make a difference? When I see someone in need, how can I help? When I see a wrong being done, how do I change it to make it right? Do I send my children to school or do I keep them at home? Do I go to school to teach or do I not? Do I go to work or that meeting and possibly be exposed to Covid or do I not? Who do I vote for in

the coming election? Which candidate will lead this country or do their job in a Christian manner? Life has never been simple but it seems life is even more complicated than ever.

Paul states that we must be transformed by renewing our minds. Then we will be able to discern what is the will of God, that which is good and acceptable and perfect. Renew our minds – read scripture daily, pray at every opportunity, and really ask ourselves is this something that Jesus would do or say? Are we making a difference as Jesus made a difference? Are we doing good and what is right in the eyes of God? Will God look at us and say "Well done, good and faithful servant", or not. Be discerning at all times. God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are with you every second of every day. Use them to help you be Christ to everyone you meet. Amen.
