When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

"What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Sermon

The Rev. Nancy L Threadgill

Sometimes when I am preparing a sermon, I wonder what gives me the right to stand here and preach God's word to you. What makes me think that I even have a ghost of a chance of reaching any of you with what I have to say? One would think that with studying at seminary for three years, being ordained a deacon and then a priest, I would feel confident in my abilities. Sometimes I have all the confidence in the world. Other times I don't. What is the difference? Sometimes it is in how I approach the task. Sometimes it is just what has been happening in the world, in the life of the church or just in my personal life that affects how I approach writing and giving a sermon. Sometimes it is whether I can feel God's presence with me, guiding my words and intonation as I write and/or speak. Most of the time I have no idea how what I say and do are going to be received. But God knows and sometimes I know it too, and sometimes, I don't. But that is OK.

In our Gospel today, Jesus is questioned by the chief priests and elders about who or what has given him the authority to heal and teach the way he does. He could have answered the question outright by saying that God has given him the authority but his questioners would not have believed him. He answered with a question of his own which they couldn't answer because there would have been problems with either answer that they did not want to deal with. Jesus knew this

when he asked the question. I think what he really wanted them to do is look at his actions and listen to his words and learn from them. He wanted them to copy what he was doing and living by what he said rather than continue to ask about authority.

This is what St. Paul says in his letter to the Philippians. "If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others." In the time of Jesus and yes, also in our own time, this is what is expected of me and of you. We are called to show love, compassion and sympathy. We are called to regard others as better than ourselves.. We are called to look not at our own interests but to the interests of others.

As you all well know, this is what I preach and, with God's help, this is how I live my life – to love God above all else and to love my neighbor as Jesus loves me. Amen.
