Children's Church is Here! Grown-ups Needed!

When I was about five years old, my Sunday school teacher taught that "Jesus is with us all the time." I was a restless and inattentive child, but for some reason, that sentence stuck. From that moment on, I took Jesus with me wherever I went. We climbed trees together and had picnics. He was even brave enough to ride on the back of my tricycle.

In that lesson, Jesus transformed from a vague bearded figure in a bathrobe into my First Friend. That Friendship was foundational to my faith and has seen me through the hardest times of my life.

Oddly, I have no memory of the teacher, not even her face. She may have considered her lesson trite or even silly. She may have thought of herself as a 'cat-herder' or babysitter. But I consider her one of the most impactful people of my life.

Children's ministry is essential to welcoming children to the church. It lets them hear the ancient stories in words that are familiar to them, and makes lessons concrete in games and crafts. It provides a foundation for their faith and relationship with God. It helps them feel truly a part of the family of God.

St. Mark's Children's Church has started, but it needs more volunteers to continue. You can be as active as you like with planning or presenting, or you can just sip coffee and watch to help keep the children safe. All talents and personalities are welcome, and you have no idea the impact you can have.

Ham Loaf Sale

St Mark's is planning a Ham Loaf sale this Spring. We hope you may be available to help with this effort for the benefit of the church and our community.



- Our prep day will be Saturday, March 15, beginning at 9:00 AM.
 - We need people to measure ingredients, weigh meat, mix the ham loaves, wrap them, make the glaze and clean up. With enough volunteers we can finish in 3 to 4 hours!
- We are in need of the following supplies:
 - 15 46 oz. cans of pineapple juice
 - 9 dozen eggs
 - 2 gallons of cider vinegar
 - 19 boxes of cornflakes (cheapest brand)
 - Donations to cover the cost of the meat

We are still accepting donations of supplies and monetary donations to pay for the meat.

Ham loaves are for sale frozen with glazing sauce and baking instructions.

- One pound loaves will be available for pick-up at a cost of \$9.
- Two-pound loaves will be available for pick-up at a cost of \$17.
- We are sold out, but we're taking names in case there are extras.
- Pre-ordered loaves will be available for pickup at the Church Office after March 20.
