From the Senior Warden

I've shared this reflection before and apologize for being repetitive. However, as we enter another year in our discernment process, this passage from the prophet Jeremiah is encouraging.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD Jer 29:11.

It is a familiar passage. The context is relevant to where we are in our discernment process at St. Mark's. It is the tail end of a letter that Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the exiles in Babylon telling them that it would be a while yet before they would leave so they had better "hunker down."

Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce. ... seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.

Jet 29:5-7

Like the exiles in Babylon, we are still in that temporary state here at St. Mark's. It helps if we think of it as permanent. We are blessed to have Mother Nancy with us as Priest-in-Charge. We are blessed to have dedicated worship leaders who can fill in (even at a moment's notice) and lead Moring Prayer when Mother Nancy is not with us. We have a fantastic group of Readers and Greeters who serve at out Sunday Worship. Our Children's Church is growing. Our Calendar Committee has planned social gatherings, special services and take-out dinners for June through December. Make sure to check the schedule later in the *Grapevine*.

The Vestry has been busy, as well. ... So while we are in what might seem like a temporary state, we are moving forward making plans building houses ... planting gardens [and seeking the] peace and prosperity of the city [where we live].

Paul reminds the early Christians in Corinth that

The God who said, "Out of darkness the light shall shine!" is the same God who made his light shine in our hearts, to bring us the knowledge of God's glory shining in the face of Christ. Yet we who have this spiritual treasure are like common clay pots, in order to show that the supreme power belongs to God, not to us.

2 Corinthians 4:6-7

We use clay pots to store things. We store our treasure (shiny little gold pieces). We store bright light – our spiritual treasure. If we cut holes in the pot that light will shine through. What treasures do we at St. Mark's hold in our clay pots? Might we cut holes in the pots and allow the light to shine forth? The more it shines, the warmer, and brighter it becomes. The more it shines on others, touching them, they too feel the light and are empowered to work together to create an environment where we can grow gardens and build programs and attract new parishioners and do the work that we are called to do.

From the Discernment Committee

As we reported last month, the Discernment Committees of St. Mark's and St. Francis have been working with the Diocese on discernment of a potential candidate for the shared priest-in-charge position and were awaiting news from Canon Kim Karashin of her meeting with the candidate. She met with him a few weeks ago and he asked for some time to reflect on his discernment with us. Unfortunately, we received word from Canon Kim on Monday, June 30, that the candidate decided to withdraw from consideration. She and Bishop Ketlen plan to meet this week to discuss the matter and, even though they do not currently have any next steps to offer us, Canon Kim will let us know if there is anything to share with us after their meeting. So, while we are "back to square one," Canon Kim reminded us that, while she knows this is disappointing, ...there is always reason and room for hope. With God, there's always a "what's next".

We will continue to update everyone as we discover more information from the Diocese. Meanwhile we ask your continued prayers for the Discernment Committees of St. Francis-in-the-Fields and St. Mark's. St. Michael's of the Valley, Ligonier and St. Francis in the Fields, Somerset have partnered to launch an official chapter of <u>Holy Hikes</u> in the Diocese, known as Holy Hikes of Southwestern Pennsylvania. We piloted a series of hikes in 2024, as a way to test how the ministry would go and to understand how congregations might collaborate. After a successful initial season, we are ready to launch the ministry diocesan-wide.

The hiking season runs from May to October and the hikes take place in the morning on the third Saturday of each month. We will start the hikes at 10 a.m., but some of the team will be there about 15 minutes early to welcome hikers. If the weather is forecast to be hot, we may move the start time to 9:00 a.m. Please look for announcements on Facebook from the diocese.

The hiking schedule for 2025 is:

Saturday, July 19, 2025 - 10:00 am

<u>Winnie Palmer Nature Reserve</u> (Latrobe) - Multiple trails making a loop - 1.5 miles easy (young family friendly)

Saturday, August 16, 2025 - 10:00 am

<u>Johnstown Flood National Memorial</u> - Carriage Road Nature Trail - 1.15 miles - easy - with an optional 0.10 mile trail to the South Abutment and a 0.34 mile trail with lots of steps to the bottom of the dam (more difficult)

Saturday, September 20, 2025 - 10:00 am

Indian Creek Valley Trail - Melcroft to Indian Head section - 2.75 miles - easy

Saturday, October 18, 2025 - 10:00 am

Ohiopyle State Park - Meadow Run Trail - 2.9 miles - easy

During the hike, we hold a service of Holy Communion, stopping along the trail to read the scripture and say the prayers, while sharing the Eucharist at the end of the hike or at another appropriate setting along the trail. It's a lovely way to have a worship service!

If you or your congregation are interested in participating we invite you to join us for one of our hikes over the summer to see how we do them and learn more about how we determine which trails to use.

In addition, we believe this is an important opportunity for members of the Diocese to invite friends, family, and neighbors – especially those who might not want to attend a Sunday morning service – to something a bit different. We have found it's a wonderful way to build community beyond our four walls. If you are interested in participating, please contact our ministry team member Katie Ong.
