I had to really think about that for a while. Yes, the colorful leaves on the trees and the late blooming flowers are beautiful. For me, the lower temperatures are a welcome change because I do not tolerate heat well. But, I know, for many, the opposite is true, because they do not tolerate cold.

Change is a constant that is part of our everyday lives. We cannot get away from it even if we wanted to. Some changes are beautiful and we welcome them. Other changes, we may not appreciate as much. But change is not the only constant we encounter every day. The other constant is God. It is God who helps us in our response to change. God is who gives us strength, blessing and guidance. God is who gets us through the chances and changes of our lives. God is our crag. our rock and our stronghold. God is constant and God is faithful.

It will help you move more deeply into the mystery of the Body of Christ gathered from every family, language, people and nation as a Kingdom of priests to serve our God. (Revelation 5: 9-10)

Why would you want to take this workshop, at this time? Here are a few (but by no means all) reasons:

- God calls each one of us to love our neighbors as ourselves.
- Our nation is struggling with the impact of generations of systemic racism that affect everyone for the worse.
- We, as a diocese, have committed ourselves to a journey toward healing the wounds of racism in our region through the Beloved Community Initiative.
- As a diocese, we have also committed, by vote at diocesan convention, that all in leadership positions, in parishes or at the diocesan level, take the workshop as part of our responsibilities.
- There is always more to learn!

The Commission on Race and Reconciliation has significantly updated and reshaped the workshop for a virtual-reality online experience. If you have taken it in the past and think you could use a brush-up, it would be worth your time.

Our ministry in Christ is to love, to teach and to heal. This workshop will further equip us to be healers.

Christmas Stocking Stuffer Project 2025

For many years we have joined with parishioners from other churches to provide stuffed Christmas stockings to the 335 patients of Torrance State Hospital. These patients are persons who require long-term in-hospital care for behavioral health disorders (mental illness). For many patients, this is the only gift they receive and is the highlight of their holiday season. The staff and patients greatly appreciate your efforts in making their Christmas a happy and memorable moment.

This year we have been asked to provide stuffed stockings for 15 men. To ensure that one patient does not receive substantially more than the patient sitting beside him, *all participating churches have been given guidelines regarding the minimum number and types of items to be included in each stocking*. Please select from the required items or additional suggested donation items lists below for your donations. A box for your donations will be in the Parish Hall. *Please make your donations on or before Sunday, November 23*, 2025.

Gift Items for One Stocking

- (1) pair of ankle OR crew socks—any color (No High TUBE socks due to strangulation issues)
- (1) bottle of shampoo OR stick deodorant OR bottle of body wash
- (1) activity, word search, or cross word book, OR coloring book (no staples) OR playing cards
- (1) bag of chips OR (1) pack of crackers OR (1) pack of cookies OR (1) snack cake
- (1) big candy bar OR small handful of mini candy bars OR (1) box of individual powdered drink mix packets
