A Note from Nancy – February 2026

From the Discernment Committee

Members of Discernment Committees and Senior Wardens of St. Mark's and St. Francis in the Fields met with Bishop Ketlen Solak on Thursday, January 15, 2026. The meeting was requested following Rev. Nancy Threadgill's announcement that she will retire effective March 1 of this year. It was a productive meeting and all were candid sharing their thoughts and ideas

Various concerns were aired and there was brainstorming about how the two congregations might be served by clergy until a fulltime priest can be found. Asked if there is a list of "supply priests," Bishop said that the number is limited. Most of the priests who serve as supply priests are retired and are not interested in driving from the Pittsburgh area out to Johnstown/Somerset.

All agreed that not offering a Holy Eucharist service for months on end would have a negative impact. Several attendees asked if offering a Deacon's Mass on some consistent basis might be an interim solution. All agreed that the Diocese should take the lead in identifying and encouraging people who would consider coming to the Johnstown and Somerset churches to celebrate Eucharist on a supply basis.

Bishop Ketlen shared that there has been discussion at the Diocesan level about the needs of the smaller churches, especially those on the edge of the Diocese. Diocesan leadership is aware of the impact that the absence of a priest has and is in the process of developing a "Small Church Missioner" whose ministry will be to care for the smaller churches.

Bishop Ketlan also assured all that she will be more actively involved in seeking a candidate for the priest position at Johnstown/Somerset. She also encouraged the parishes to look at what ministries might be done by the laity, such as pastoral outreach. Representatives of the two congregations assured the bishop that the shared priest relationship can work.

Also present at the meeting was the Rev. Canon Joann Saylor, the Canon to the Ordinary who is taking over Canon Kim Karashin's responsibilities working with churches in transition.

We will continue to keep everyone updated as we continue in the discernment process.

The strawberries, blueberries and baby spinach can't be purchased until Thursday of that week. We're asking for monetary donations to defray the costs and let us do the shopping.





Well another year has begun here at the Pet Pantry and we are seeing new families coming to us for help. Because of the generosity of so many, during the months of November and December, we can continue to keep our doors open.
